Our Wow starts this term ...



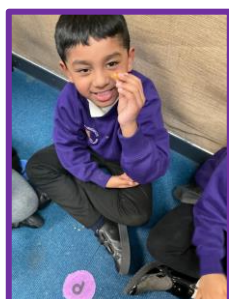
Year 5 have been exploring rivers, using oil pastels and creating their own collage pictures
